The Foxfire Golf and C.C. of Naples, FL. In Collier County

Foxfire is a private, gated and bundled, 385 acre, 27 hole geriatric golfing community with 931 units in Naples, Florida operational since 1984. We have been involved with Bluebird nesting for about 15 years and presently have about 54 nest boxes. Our maximum number of fledglings was 121 two years ago and we average about 85-110. As a result, bluebirds now are living in adjacent communities. This in itself is very satisfying!

This year, after viewing the bluebird nest-cam of the Penny Retirement Community on our computer, we decided to try to establish a similar set-up at Foxfire. We then initiated inquiries with folks already successful with such a venture. They suggested contacting via e-mail a company named Spy On A Bird <u>Spyonabird@spyonabird.com</u> - their postal address is - Spy On A Bird LLC, 12201-N. NC Hwy. 150, Suite 22, PMB 244, Winston Salem, NC 27127. We dealt with a lady named Denise Gibo who guided us computer illiterates patiently through the process. We purchased a POE camera, mounted and focused in a plastic weathered wood blue bird nest box (approved by the National Bluebird Society of America), with an injector and 325 foot Burial CAT 5E Cable, a wireless G router-link 54 Mbps, a pole mounting system (includes 60 inch pole one inch in diameter with twist in ground socket that sinks 20 inches into the ground) with a top mount for the bird house - all shipped one week after payment.

We decided to use a site for the nest box cam that had at least one successful clutch over each of the past three years, without predation and within sight of golfers and several residences.

We secured the services of an employee (a computer guru) of our community security company to access the nest cam to our computers via the internet. We came up with a password and user name and Bingo!! It works!! Within two weeks, a male bluebird was spotted entering the box for very short periods. This occurred initially on December 10th. In this part of Florida, we generally see bluebird nesting and territorial activities start in mid-February.


We had/have some concerns regarding this project. They include cost, safety of camera and box from theft would the birds choose to use our new box after all of our time and work, should we divulge the location of this box, should we open it to non-community surveillance, and maintenance problems that may occur.

Hope some of you folks might benefit from our experience and even be stimulated to try your hand at this endeavor. It really was fun and a learning experience.


